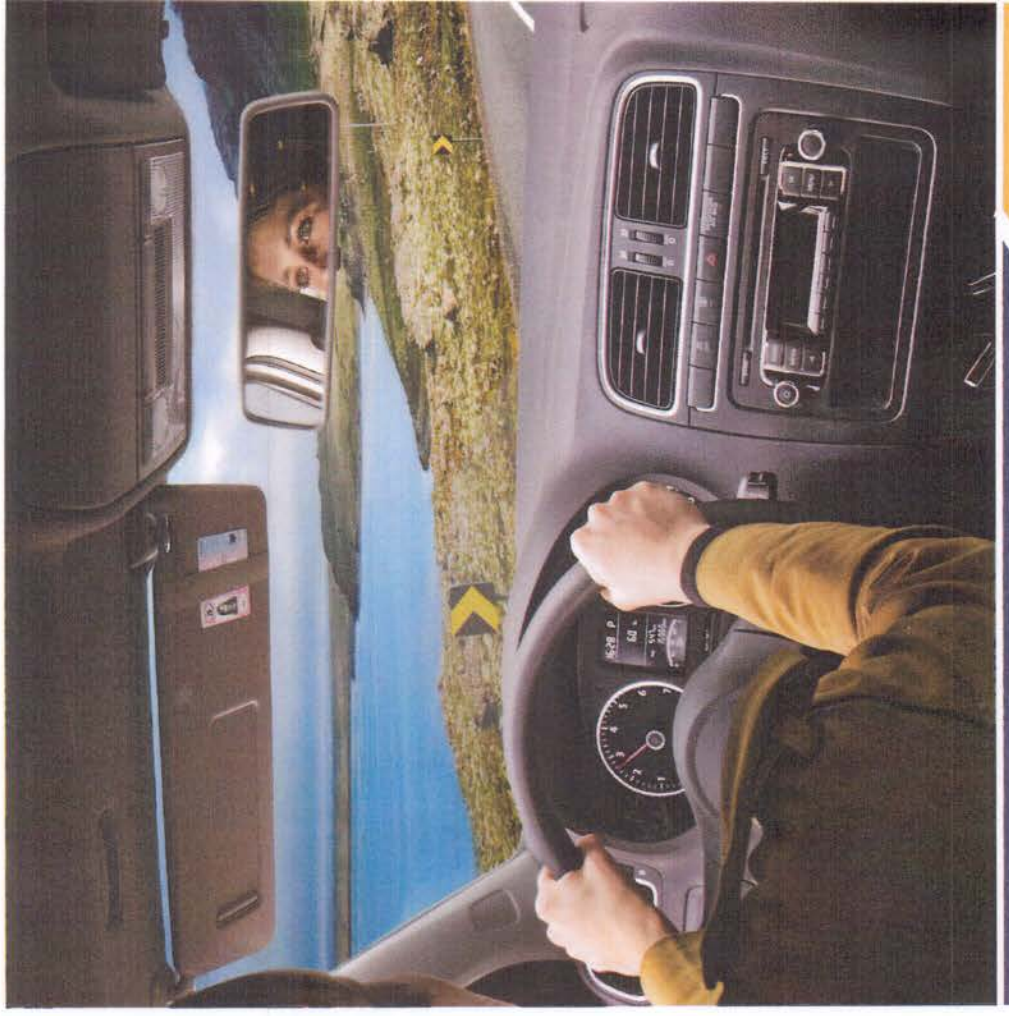

New design for driving licences

International standards – increased security

The format of all Icelandic driving licences issued as of 1 June 2013 will be different to those issued in the last 12 years.

The company, Any Security Printing of Budapest, Hungary, manufactures the licences, having tendered the lowest bid. The design of the licence was part of the tender and the National Commissioner of the Icelandic Police holds the rights to it.

The look of the licence, the information contained on it and its security features are in accordance with Regulation 830/2011 on driving licences and the EU directive and regulation on driving licences.

Visible or tangible security features were emphasised, but other features require ultraviolet or infrared light to be seen.

VISIBLE AND TANGIBLE SECURITY FEATURES

- 1 The words "ÖKUSKIRTEINI" (driving licence) and "ISLAND" (Iceland) are repeated and embossed in curved lines on the transparent surface where the outlines of the Icelandic flag are also embossed.
- 2 A square-shaped security mark with the shape of Iceland covers part of the passport photo. It contains the letters "IS", as well as Iceland's coat of arms. The mark is visible when the card is tilted to the sides.
- 3 An oval, white, ribbed surface can clearly be felt when a fingernail is dragged across the surface. When the card is tilted to the sides, the licence's year of issue or the letters ISL can be seen.
- 4 On the left side of the coat of arms on the backside is a small dot, the size of a speck of dust — this is in fact a symbol, legible with a magnifying glass. The symbol will be changed regularly.
- 5 Under the coat of arms on the backside is a strip that changes colours when the card is tilted to the sides.

FEATURES VISIBLE UNDER A UV OR IR LIGHT

- 6 A UV light makes all dark blue features on the licence glow, while IR turns the same features green.
- 7 If the card is put under an ultraviolet light, certain background features, i.e. outlines, patterns, pictures and text glow. UVA and UVB rays reveal different features.
- 8 Ultraviolet light reveals, inside the map of Iceland, the number and user name of the official who ordered the licence, as well as a number showing whether the card was produced in the first attempt or whether it had to be repeated due to a flaw.
- 9 If the driving licence is put under an infrared light, part of the card glows bright green, as seen in the picture to the left.
